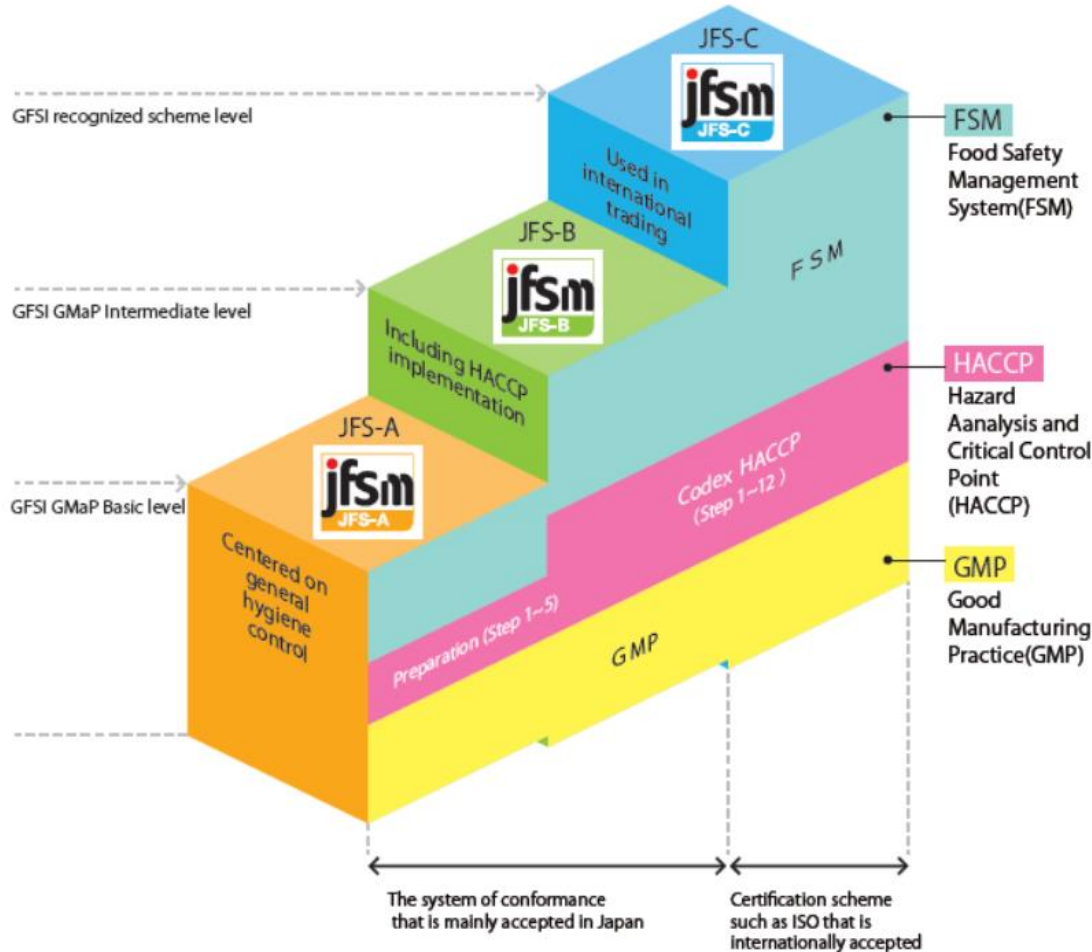

Scope for Certification / Assessment

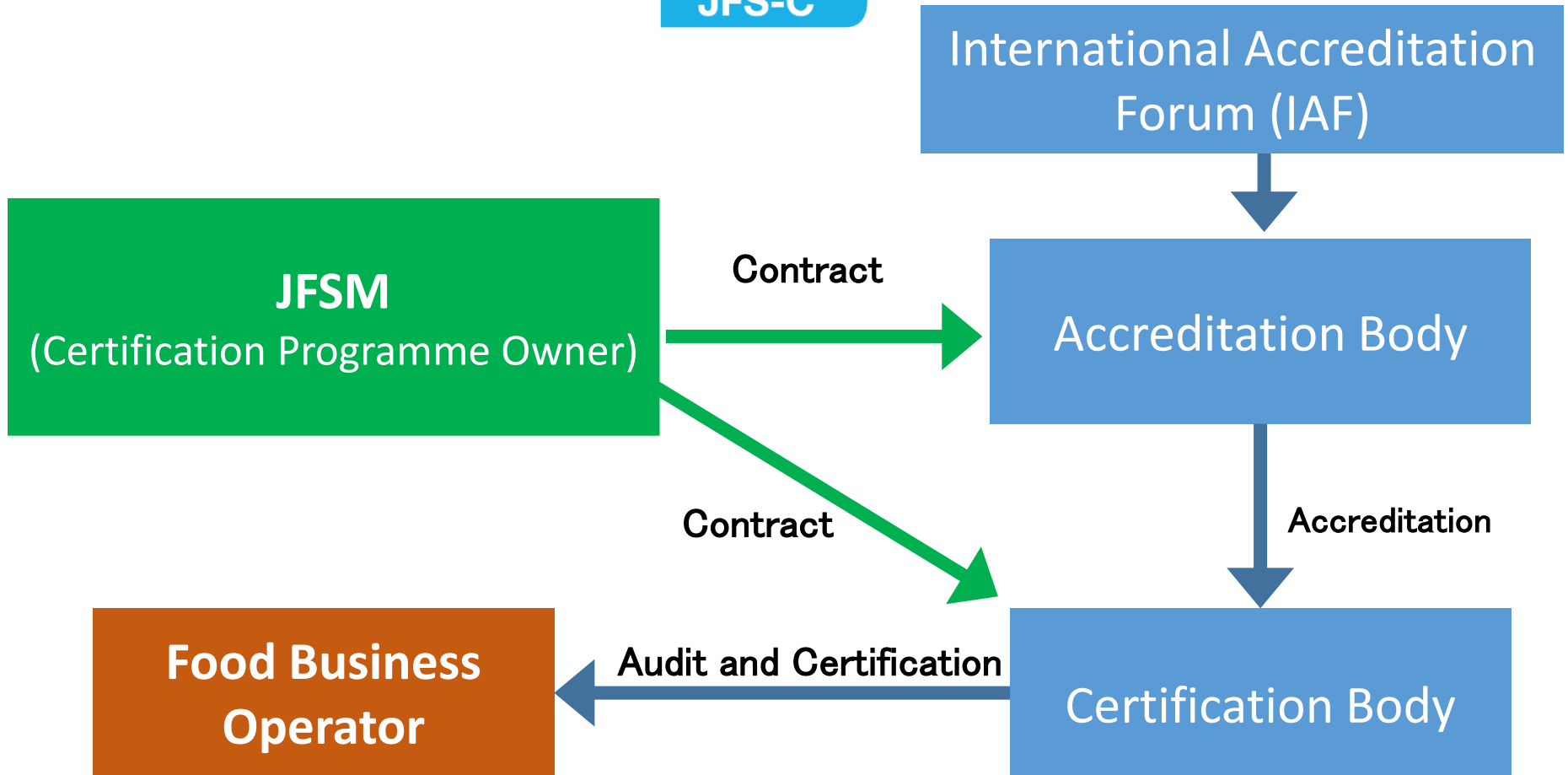
Scopes for certification (JFS-C) and conformity assessment (JFS-A/B) are as follows:

Code	Sector
EI	Processing of Animal Perishable Products
EII	Processing of Plant Perishable Products
EIII	Processing of Animal and Plant Perishable Products (Mixed Products)
EIV	Processing of Ambient Stable Products
L	Production of (Bio) Chemicals (Additives, Vitamins, Minerals, Bio-cultures, Flavourings, Enzymes and Processing Aids)



Systems of JFS Scheme and Program

- **The JFS-A** (conformity assessment program)
target: SMEs
benefit: to implement basic requirements for food safety such as GMP.

- **The JFS-B** (conformity assessment program)
target: SMEs
